In addition, the guilds have been creative in designing new events to bring current and new members into the fold. We have been closely working with the Community Engagement Department to bring events that have previously been available only in Santa Fe to some of the guilds located further from the Opera and Santa Fe.

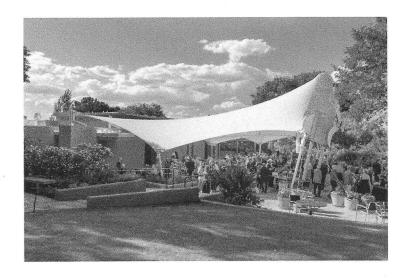
It became apparent during our nominating period that, although new members have been added, there is less interest in taking on the responsibility of member Guild board positions. While individual members are interesting in working on and continuing the events that have been enjoyed previously, they are not able to make the long-time commitments involved in Board Membership. Many of the current member guild boards have held the position for multiple years and are ready to retire.

We have, in fact, been a bit lax in our recruitment efforts for our board positions. and this fiscal year ends in good conversations about the guilds regarding how our overall operational methods can be improved to better support our member guilds.

The charts and financials included in this annual report reflect the positive changes with the expanded reopening of the Santa Fe Opera. We are working towards continuing to increase our membership numbers and, as a result, increasing support of the Community Engagement Department and ultimately the support of the Santa Fe Opera.

Our thanks go out to the Santa Fe Opera Board of Directors for their support in the guild's efforts. Also thanks to the members of the Community Engagement Department for their commitment in making our partnership a success.

Opera Opening Night Dinner and Fundraiser 2024



The evening of June 28, 2024 for the Guilds of the Santa Fe Opera, Inc. with the La Traviata opera theme dinner was a great success. After the hard work of the committee and support from Opera staff, the night was enjoyed by all. Masterpiece catered the event with the La Traviata themed menu. Kathy Murphy, formerly of the Santa Fe Opera helped orchestrate the evening.

The following committee members worked months in advance on the dinner: Joan Punt (AOG), Norman Doggett - Honorary (EVOG), Victoria Zillioux (TOG), Carolyn Haddock (TOG), Juanita Thorne-Connerty (EVOG), Yvonne O'Gara (EVOG) Terry Beery (LAOG), Shelly Brock (SFOG), Eileen Woodbury (SFOG), with Lucinda Surber, GI's Publicity Chair.

The total number of guests were 176 not including those budgeted to be compensated. The funds raised were \$8,324 which exceed last year's raised funds of \$6,735. The audience was attended by representatives from all the guilds, Santa Fe Opera board members, and attendees to the opera both local and from out of state.

Preview Dinners

The preview dinners opened to a larger number of attendees than in the past year as the opera expands to a full season. These events have been well attended in the past and people were excited to learn that this event has been reinstated. The dinners serve to introduce attendees to the opera they will be seeing that night. Speakers were well received and spent their time at the podium not just telling the story of the opera but also provided interesting insight into the history and stories behind the opera along with their personal experiences. Often attendees are seated with people they don't know and it is fun to see how everyone enjoys the dinner and conversation as they make new friends.

Members of the 5 guilds hosted these events, providing a greeting upon arrival and an escort to their table. Brochures were set on each of the tables giving information about the guilds and upcoming events that the guilds are planning. These preview dinners give opera goers an opportunity to become familiar with the 5 guilds and are an excellent opportunity to bring new members in. Hosts are not required to be guild members so it also becomes a good opportunity to add to membership by bringing non-members to share in the hosting and experience the fun of meeting so many opera lovers and getting involved.

Youth Nights Report

Both Youth Night performances were well attended with an increase of 618 attendees over last year's performances. Both the 2023 and 2024 seasons presented two Youth Night performances, so the increase in attendance is impressive. The various member guilds provided approximately 8 volunteers each night and volunteer duties have been reduced to greeting/speaking on buses, distributing flyers and greeting at the hospitality podium. Monitoring in the house is no longer necessary as there are many ushers manning those areas.

Treasurer's Report – Carolyn Haddock.

During this fiscal year, the five member guilds contributed, and Guilds, Inc. remitted \$16,652 to the Community Engagement Department of the Santa Fe Opera.

We sold 176 dinners at \$125 for the Opening Night celebration and fundraiser at Dapples Pavilion, thus grossing \$21,602. Total expenses were \$13,278 resulting in a net profit of \$8,324 a \$1,589 increase from the year before.

The most significant administrative costs were \$2,700 for tax preparation and filing, and \$1,250 for design and printing of 3,000 marketing postcards.

Guilds, Inc. ends the year with a cash balance of \$15,620, which is \$2,089 additional from where it began the year, and a healthy amount going forward into the new fiscal year.
